CORA Member Club 2025 Summaries

Association Francophone de gathet (AFga)

Club Name: Association Francophone de qathet (AFqa) formally the Club Bon Accueil Society, was founded in 1967 but the association did not become a member of CORA until 2017.

Location: Powell River, British Columbia, Strait of Georgia, Powell Lake, Okeover Arm

Club Particulars: AFqa has as its goal to provide services and activities for francophones and francophiles in Powell River and communities beyond. Within it's programming it operates a program called Pagayer en Santé (Paddling For Health), centred around an ultra-light canoe, a Vortex, the association acquired in 2016 through a federal grant for seniors. The program is designed to offer opportunities for individuals to experience outrigger canoeing at the same time explore the coastline of the upper Sunshine Coast from Saltery Bay to Lund, including Okeover Arm and Powell Lake. The ability to speak French is not a requirement of joining AFqa or Pagayer en Santé. The program takes place between May and October twice a week. Thanks to the Suncoast Paddling Club, Pagayer en Santé is able to borrow lifejackets and paddles for prospective paddlers. Also, due to the generosity of the Powell River Dragonboat Society, Pagayer en Santé has the use of a light weight trailer, which has enabled the Vortex to be transported to various locations along the coast.

Note: The Suncoast Paddling Club has access to the Vortex outside of Pagayer en Santé's programming and for CORA sanctioned races as per an agreement between the two organizations.

Membership: The AFqa membership in 2025 is at 53 of which 25 paddled with Pagayer en Santé at least once this season. Note that about half the number of paddlers that participated in Pagayer en Santé were also members of the Suncoast Paddling Club and therefore also members of CORA.

Goals, Activities, Equipment:

In 2025, AFqa attempted to organize an activity with other organizations and vendors in respect to National Canoe Day. Unfortunately, due to insurance issues, the project had to be cancelled. In June 2026, the association plans to hold a 'Pagayer en Santé Open House' under its existing insurance policy with its current insurer to promote outrigger canoeing and Pagayer en Santé.

After 10 years of usage, the association's only canoe, the Vortex, has endured some damage as a result of transporting it from various locations along the coast. Launching as well as retrieving the canoe from beaches (at times with novices) has led to minor scrapes along the hull. It is intended to have the canoe repaired, in particular, to have the venturi removed (this version of the Vortex was a prototype) and the hull repainted in 2026. AFqa plans to initiate fund raising activities but hopes as well to receive financial assistance from CORA through the Repair, Maintenance and Equipment Grant.

The other item earmarked for the future is the replacement of the canoe cover for the Vortex by 2027 as the existing cover is nearing the end of its life.

AUMAKUA Paddling Club

Founded in 2022 and located on the South Shore of Montreal, Quebec.

Aumakua is a private paddling club where members train and compete in six person outrigger canoes (OC6). The club also provides access to OC1s and an OC2, allowing members to train individually and, at times, compete in those boats as well.

The club is made up largely of former dragon boat paddlers from a team that dissolved during the COVID pandemic. This explains why, although the outrigger club itself is relatively young (established in 2022), most of its members have already been paddling together for more than 12 years.

Why do we exist?

Through the practice of outrigger canoeing, we encourage and support professionals in leading active lives, free from worry and stress. Beyond sport, our broader goal is to give every member the opportunity to embrace and embody the spirit of Kokua — a cornerstone of the club's identity.

What is Kokua?

Kokua means "to help," but it carries a deeper meaning:

- Helping others without expecting anything in return
- The sincere act of giving of oneself for the benefit of others, not for personal gain
- Mutual support, expressed through direct actions or simple acts of kindness

Kokua is a mindset that unites members to achieve more collectively than they ever could alone. It can go further — it can become a way of life. It's about living fully, building genuine relationships, and fostering a healthy, generous community.

2026 Objectives

Aumakua typically races in four summer events:

- Défi Haunani Outrigger Challenge
- WAI NUI WHY NOT Race
- TIOC
- Ottawa River Paddle Challenge

For 2026, the club coaches will set achievable objectives based on the results of the past three years. That said, most members race for the joy of paddling rather than for competitive results. After all, the club's primary purpose is to provide a meaningful break from professional life.

Comox Valley Canoe Racing Club

Overview

The Comox Valley Canoe Racing Club (CVCRC) is an outrigger canoe paddling club based in Courtenay, British Columbia. Members paddle on the Courtenay River, Comox Bay, and the greater Salish Sea, the ancestral waters of the K'ómoks First Nation.

Founded in 1995, the club has grown into a vibrant paddling community that welcomes recreational and competitive paddlers alike. CVCRC is governed by a six-person executive board and maintains a strong volunteer base supporting programs, events, and equipment maintenance.

Facilities & Fleet

CVCRC operates from a secure compound at the Courtenay Airpark Marina, which provides easy boat launch access and secure storage.

The club maintains a growing fleet of high-performance canoes, currently including:

- 1 x Malolo UL
- 1 x Vortex UL
- 2 x Mirage Spec

Looking ahead to 2026, the club plans to purchase a new HydraPro canoe to expand racing opportunities and modernize its fleet.

Programs & Community

The club runs both competitive and recreational programs, welcoming paddlers of all ages and abilities. Practices are organized throughout the week, with a focus on safety (including regular huli-recovery training) and teamwork.

One of CVCRC's key development goals for 2026 is the establishment of a junior paddling program. Our intention is to introduce youth in the Comox Valley to the sport of outrigger canoeing and build future generations of paddlers.

Events & Partnerships

CVCRC plays a prominent role in the Vancouver Island outrigger racing community.

- The club shares hosting duties for the Island Iron—a major outrigger racing event—with Latitude 48 Paddling Club, alternating years between venues.
- In September 2025, CVCRC was proud to host the CORA Distance Nationals on Comox Lake, welcoming hundreds of paddlers from across western Canada.

These events strengthen the Comox Valley's reputation as a hub for paddling and bring the broader outrigger community together through competition and collaboration.

Membership & Governance

The club currently supports a membership of ~65 paddlers, supported by a six-member executive board. CVCRC continues to encourage new members to try outrigger canoeing through accessible introductory sessions and community outreach. We hope to see our junior program result in membership growth through family involvement.

Outlook

The Comox Valley Canoe Racing Club continues to build momentum—expanding its fleet, deepening community roots, and growing participation across all ages. With major events like the 2025 CORA Distance

Nationals ahead and a youth program on the horizon, the club is well positioned to strengthen both its competitive presence and its role as a cornerstone of paddling culture in British Columbia.

We would like to thank CORA for all their continued support this season. This year we have had 70 active members. Comox was proud to host paddlers at this year's Island Iron and the Nationals at Comox Lake in September. Three of our paddlers competed in the World Long Distance race in Brazil in August. The club has two spec boats two unlimited boats and have just ordered a new Hydra arriving in March and a small fleet of singles and doubles. We have access to a river an ocean estuary and the open ocean and Comox Lake.

Fairway Gorge Paddling Club (FGPC)

Legal name: Fairway Gorge Paddling Club Society

Founded: February 14, 2014

Staff: 30 year-round staff, trainers and coaches supplemented by additional summer staff

Location: Selkirk Waterfront Community, Victoria, BC, on the Gorge Waterway (part of Victoria's harbour

network)

Fairway Gorge Paddling Club (FGPC) is a leading multisport paddling centre serving Vancouver Island and the broader Pacific Northwest. Situated on Victoria's scenic Gorge Waterway, FGPC operates a purpose-built waterfront facility featuring gated docks, floating outbuildings, water stations, dedicated OC and small-craft launch docks, power, video security, and after-hours patrols. The club also operates a member-only gym staffed by full-time trainers, offering paddling-focused strength and conditioning programs, classes, showers, lockers, and towel service. Gym and boat storage memberships are capped and maintained by wait-lists due to demand.

FGPC supports multiple paddling disciplines—including outrigger canoe, dragon boat, sprint kayak, surfski/ocean kayak, and stand-up paddleboarding—and currently serves approximately 450 outrigger athletes in addition to approximately 800 other on-water members (dragon boat, sprint kayak, monthly ocean kayak members) and 250 gym members. FGPC also provides a variety of "group adventure" options for schools, corporate and institutional groups, including dragon boat, kayak and outrigger programs in the warmer months. The club owns and operates a 12-boat dragon boat fleet, as well as an outrigger fleet that includes 4 ultralight OC6 canoes (Vortex, 2 Malolos, Hydra) and 8 spec OC6 canoes (6 Advantage, 2 Mirage). The Advantages are rigged as "V12s," serving sold-out weekly V12 programs for members who don't want to or can't participate in annual self-rescue drills required for all other outrigger programs. Small-craft resources include 4 Huki, 2 Ares, 2 Draco, and 2 V1s, plus 60 private-storage racks.

FGPC hosts year-round racing, including winter and summer small-boat race series and three annual OC6 events: a 10km V12 race in February; Kan U Hamit each March, an OC6 sprint race expanding to include a small-boat sprint day in 2026; and Wetdashe each November, a dry-change OC6 charity race supporting the BC Cancer Agency. Unique to FGPC, all race boats are club-supplied, eliminating the need for trailering.

Looking ahead to 2026, FGPC will refine and expand its outrigger fleet, adding a second Hydra OC6, one V1, and two OC1s, while prioritizing growth in dragon boat programming as outrigger programs are operating at capacity.

Falcon Canoe Club

Falcon Canoe Club is brand new to the organization and had their first novice race, placing first.

The paddlers were ecstatic about the experience and look forward to many more outrigger races.

The training helps some of the paddlers build their confidence and improve their mental health. They are excited for many more races to come. Some paddlers look forward to taking this further to travel the world.

False Creek Racing Canoe Club (FCRCC)

The legal name of the club is False Creek Canoe Society. The club was founded in 1987 with CORA Hall of Famers Andrea Dillon and Don Irvine among those who founded the club. FCRCC is located in Vancouver British Columbia and is fortunate to have access to both the sheltered waters of False Creek and the open ocean waters of Burrard Inlet which means members can surf when the wind is up or take shelter in False Creek as weather and training needs dictate and can paddle both during daytime hours and after dark.

Besides outrigger, FCRCC also offers dragon boat, marathon canoe and flatwater sprint canoe disciplines. Many of our paddlers paddle more than one discipline including OC1 and V1. FCRCC offers both recreational and competitive team options with many members paddling at world class levels. FCRCC has over 230 members who paddle on seven regular OC6 teams or cross-training dragon boat teams.

The club has one OC4, three Mirage spec OC6 canoes, one Bradley OC6, two Malolos unlimited canoes and two Matahina unlimited canoes. FCRCC operates OC6 out of its Burrard compound at the Burrard Civic Marina in Vanier Park and has its office, small boats, flatwater sprint canoes and dragon boats at the False Creek Community Center on Granville Island with access to the water there at Alder Bay.

The club hosts one of the PNWORCA Winter Series Small Boat races in late February/early March. The Vancouver Va'a team hosts the two day March Madness event at Vanier Park in March and also the Bowen 360 race around Bowen Island in June. The club's outrigger teams actively participate in the CORA Cup race series and in 2025 seven FCRCC crews won the CORA Cup in their category with FCRCC earning the most CORA Cup points of all the CORA clubs. FCRCC has members racing at the IVF Distance and Sprint World Championships each year. Most recently five FCRCC members raced in Niteroi, Brazil in the 2025 IVF World Distance Championships. Crews often race internationally at the Columbia Gorge and Hawaii as well as other locations around the world. Vancouver Va'a recently won the Open Mixed division at the ATIR race in Hong Kong.

The club goals for 2026 include growing an youth outrigger program and purchasing two additional unlimited OC6s as well as replacing the aging fleet of C-Lion OC1s.

The Fraser Valley Paddling Club

The Fraser Valley Paddling Club, established in 2001, is located in the picturesque village of Harrison Hot Springs, British Columbia.

Our clubhouse, floating on beautiful Harrison Lake, is 10'x30' with 3 slips and a dock space for assembling small boats. We have four OC6s: a Bradley Lightning; a Bradley Stryker; an Advantage; and a Calmar. The club also has five small boats: one C-Lion, one Pegasus; one Huki V1B; an Outrigger Connection Fuze; as well as a Huki OC2. This facility also provides storage for personal canoes.

With 40 outrigger paddlers FVPC has a number of options for members to paddle year 'round.

H.O.T. (Harrison Outrigger Team), coached by Scott Borle, has competitive Women's and Mixed Teams. H.O.T. enters 6 and solo racers in every CORA Cup event as well as many other local races throughout the season. In addition to these Canadian events, members of H.O.T. compete at PNWORCA races, several other races across North America, and overseas. Since 2018, H.O.T. racers have competed in IVF World Events (team and solo), and in 2026 will have a racer competing in Singapore World Sprints in both team and solo categories.

FVPC also has several recreational teams that participate in a number of races throughout the year. Members of these teams also participate in local smallboats races.

As well, FVPC encourages many non-racing members to stay active and engaged with social paddles.

Harrison Hot Springs is an appealing setting for paddling and we like to share its charms. In 2019, FVPC hosted CORA Nationals. In 2018, FVPC hosted a CORA Cup Race.

FVPC is currently in the process of rebuilding our facilities to be bigger and better in order to house our growing club. This year we are launching a new dock and floating platform to accommodate the expanded clubhouse planned for 2026. We have been actively fundraising to reach this point. The new clubhouse will be nearly double the size of our current building, allowing for more smallboat storage, larger changing areas, as well as space for canoe maintenance. We are excited to be creating a comfortable spot for our paddlers to gather.

TSCC Makakoa Outrigger Canoe Club

- TSCC Makakoa Outrigger Canoe Club (the "Club") was founded in 2010 by Chris Hebert, John Ha, and Thomas Goldthorpe. It is now run by a leadership committee comprised of member volunteers.
- The Club is part of the Toronto Sailing and Canoe Club ("TSCC") located at 1391 Lakeshore Blvd West in Toronto on the shore of Lake Ontario. As the name suggests the club is comprised of sailors and paddlers and is home to 3 Dragonboat clubs as well. TSCC is a fairly large facility with change rooms, showers, full kitchen, bar, dining room, and outdoor patio.
- From its inception in 2010 Makakoa has steadily grown and now typically has over 60 registered
 members per year. The Club currently has 3 Spec OC6's and one OC2 which are available to its
 members. About a third of the members have their own OC1 or OC2 most of which are stored at TSCC.
 Makakoa offers structured workouts as well as social paddles to its members. Members can paddle 7
 days a week if they so choose and there are evening and early morning sessions available.
- Makakoa is the host club for the Toronto International Outrigger Challenge ("TIOC) which is the largest outrigger canoe race in Eastern Ontario held usually in September.
- The club usually participates in local races like Wai Nui Why Not, Sunnyside Sprint Championships, and Montreal outrigger challenge. Makakoa does not have a trailer for its OC6s so participation is dependent on obtaining a boat at the race event. In past Makakoa has participated in races throughout the United States including Boston, New Hampshire, San Francisco, Catalina, and Hawaii. Due to the current political climate, many paddlers are reluctant to go to the U.S. so participation for 2026 will likely be very limited across the border.
- Makakoa would like to purchase an Unlimited OC6 since this seems to be the direction most outrigger clubs are heading. Costs, of course, is the main factor as well as storage space at TSCC. The Makakoa leadership team will be discussing this further at its next general meeting in February.

Penticton Paddle Sports Association, founded in 2023 brings together outrigger and dragonboat paddlers as one non-profit organization. Formerly Penticton Racing Canoe Club, founded in 1997 and Penticton Dragonboat Festival Society/GO Rowing and Paddling Association which started a year or so later.

Our boathouse is on Skaha Lake in Penticton, BC, though we host races on Okanagan Lake as well. Penticton is one of only two cities in the world that sits between two lakes. The building goes back to the early 1960s and our organization is actively working towards rebuilding the facility. It had a flatwater history in the 1980s and some of that equipment is still housed in the rafters (C1, K1).

Penticton Paddle Sports offers OC1, OC2, surfski and a couple of SUPs for fun. Our OC membership is growing since we brought dragonboat and OC together. Currently we have 50-55 members paddling outrigger and over 200 in dragonboat.

Club particulars: We currently have 44 members. We paddle recreationally and competitively. We have two OC6 Calmars, one OC6 Mirage, one OC4, one OC2 and one OC1. We also have a 3-canoe trailer. (This year we acquired the trailer, Mirage and one of the Calmars. They are all pre-owned). We rent space in the Sproat Lake Community Hall for storage. We keep our OC6s and OC4 in the water year-round. We are fortunate to have free moorage at the Sproat Lake Marina (in winter) and at Sproat Lake Landing (in summer). We have a small shed at Sproat Lake Landing where we keep our in-use equipment. We have a website and are on Facebook.

Activities: some of our members train for races. We participate in races in Victoria and Nanaimo. We also host races and clinics. We host the Sproat Lake Youth Change Race in August, which is a 2-day event where we practice changes, paddling drills, and hulis on one day and then do a 10K change race the next day. This is a fun couple of days for the Youth and Parents and we include the camping and food in the event fees. SLCC is also planning a 2-day event in July 2026 (18/19) called 4 Arm Fiasco on Sproat Lake. The race will have the following race categories: OC-6, OC-1, V-1, OC-2, SUP, Surfski and distances (20km, 15km, 10km, and 5km.) The 5km race course will have a community participation focus allowing any human powered vessel to enter. Participants can enter multiple events.

Club goals and 2026 plans:

We are planning to do some maintenance/repairs on our new (pre-owned) boat trailer, Mirage and Calmar in 2026 as well as more regular maintenance on all our boats (annual sanding/painting, etc). We are hoping to attract more members to our club through advertising, open houses and more public presence. (Now that we have a trailer, we can put the canoes in the water at the Harbour during public events). We will also continue participating in some races as well as hosting events and clinics.

Suncoast Paddling Club

The Suncoast Paddling Club (formerly the Powell River Outrigger Canoe Society, incorporated 2001) is based on beautiful Powell Lake where most paddling takes place. We also take advantage of the Salish Sea for ocean outings. We are a small club of 30 members with both recreational and competitive paddling groups.

The club focuses exclusively on outrigger canoeing, offering training and participation in OC6, OC2, and OC1 canoes. Our fleet of canoe's include two Matahinas OC6's, one Vortex OC6, one Advantage OC6 and One Huki OC2. We also have a motorized coach boat and canoe trailer that we can use to transport up to 6 canoes for road trips.

The club operates year-round, providing coached sessions, recreational paddles, and participation in distance and sprint races, including a number of events organized by the Canadian Outrigger Racing Association (CORA), at provincial and international levels. All programming is volunteer-run, with trained coaches and steers people overseeing safety and operations.

Sunnyside Paddling Club

Sunnyside Paddling Club (SPC) is a Toronto-based, non-profit community organization dedicated to promoting paddle sports. Originally founded in 2005 as the National Dragonboat Club, it rebranded as Sunnyside Paddling Club in 2012 to reflect both its location at Humber Bay Shores and its expanded offerings.

Today, SPC is one of the largest paddling clubs in Canada — and possibly in North America — with over 1,300 active members participating across more than 70 dragon boat teams. The club offers a wide range of paddling disciplines, including dragon boating, outrigger canoeing, kayaking, stand-up paddleboarding (SUP), and recreational canoeing.

SPC also runs a youth summer camp called Small Waves Strong Minds, designed for kids aged 7–17. In this program, campers learn paddling skills across various craft types (kayaks, SUPs, outrigger canoes, and dragon boats), while also engaging in STEM-based activities (science, technology, engineering, mathematics) and dryland fitness.

For adult paddlers, the club provides a Small Boat Membership that allows drop-in access to its outrigger canoe fleet. Rentals are also available for those who want to try kayaking, SUPs, and canoes without committing to membership.

SPC operates out of the historic Sunnyside Pavilion on Lake Ontario's shore, and maintains a strong partnership with the City of Toronto, reflecting a commitment to community access and waterfront engagement.

In sum, Sunnyside Paddling Club combines high-level competitive paddling (especially in dragon boat) with welcoming, inclusive recreational programs, making paddling accessible to people of all ages and experience levels.

Sunnyside's competitive OC program offers a high-performance paddling track, providing access to their fleet of outrigger canoes—including lightweight, OC1s, OC2s, and OC6s. Outrigger train in a structured group setting under the guidance of experienced coaches, honing technical stroke mechanics, race strategies, and team cohesion. While the OC program is growing, SPC emphasizes both high performance and community, allowing competitive paddlers to develop within a supportive and well-resourced paddling club.
